Abstract

This study entitled Role of organic tea farming in rural development "A Case Study of Gorkha tea Farming of Suryodaya Municipality ward no.9, Ilam", Nepal was an attempt to analyze income generating activities of the farmers living around the area This study pursued social research methodology, both qualitative and quantitative. It was based on the exploratory and descriptive study research designs. HHs survey was done with the semi structured questionnaire. The data collected from observation and questionnaires were minutely analyzed.
