Abstract

The research entitled "The Suppression of Women's Voice in Leo Tolstoy's *The Death of Ivan Ilyich* and *The Kreutzer Sonata*" is an effort which, with the light of feminism, tries to show how the social patriarchal system undersizes, marginalizes and underpresents women. Both of these texts highlight patriarchal gender roles and imprison women within a home. There is a stereotypical presentation of female characters.
