ABSTRACT

The present study entitled **Role of Visual Aids in developing writing skill** attempted to present an action research and found out that the average score increment of students' after the intervention of visual aids has been increased in high ratio than before introducing visual aids in classes. The study was carried out by using both primary and secondary sources of data. Altogether 30 students of Grade X of The Rising English Secondary School were purposively selected as the sample population. The major tools of data collection were the test items used during the research study. The conclusion and finding of research is drawn after comparing and analyzing the students' score of pre test and post test. The major findings of the research showed that the students' achievement was greater in post test in comparison to pre test after introducing and using visual aids in secondary level classes. It can be said that use of visual aids in the language classroom is effective.
