ABSTRACT

The present thesis entitled 'Listening Proficiency of the Eleventh Graders is a study to find out and compare the listening comprehension proficiency of the students of Higher secondary level in Taplejung district on the basis of the variables; sector, public and private and sex; boys and girls in different test items used in the course of data collection. Here, the boarding schools with +2 have been taken as private and the government aided schools with +2 have been taken as public schools and so have been the students for this study.
