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Abstract

This research work explores Anita Nair's Novel Ladies Coupe (2001), as an empowerment of women to form new identity, who are constrained by traditional gender roles of a patriarchal society. The female characters in Nair's novel struggle for their independence by violating the century long patriarchal norms and values. However, this thesis examines the female protagonist's subversion of traditional gender roles to discover their real identity.
