Abstract

This project entitled "Dystopia in Adam Johnson's *The Orphan Master's Son*" explores the negative influences of science and technology in human life. Advanced science and technology are misused by totalitarian North Korean government that has resulted in to sense of loss, misunderstanding, maladjustment, identity crisis, and conflict.
