Abstract

The Boy in the Striped Pyjama is an ironic dramatization of horrible ground reality regarding Nazi Holocaust. In an ironic mode the film represents what were rational principles on the basis of which Jews were beaten bullied, lacerated, condemned and executed in the concentration camp. Ralf is the monster who thinks that the callous execution of Jews ensures the progress and security of Germans.
