Abstract

Impact of Tourism on Livelihood in Sankhuwasabha 'A Case Study of Tinjure_Milke_Jaljale and Guphapokhari Area' is representative of the reality Main thrust of the study is to assess the level of awareness among the tourism in rural area to identify the problems faced by local people and to explore impact of tourism.

Present study was carried out mostly on the basis of exploratory research design as because the study was done focusing on constraint and potentiality of impact of tourism on livelihood in the study area. The collected data were both qualitative and quantitative. Both primary and secondary data were used to describe and analyze the study area. Interview and observation are main tools of data collection.
