ABSTRACT

The present research study entitled **Practices of Using Library for Self-Learning** aimed to find out students' practices of using and their views towards library. To meet the objectives of this research study, I purposively selected 50 higher secondary level students from 5 different higher secondary schools of Rukum district. Judgemental sampling procedure was used to sample the population. Under the tools of data collection, questionnaire was used. The responses given by students on different issues of library were critically analyzed and interpreted using both qualitative and quantitative approach. The findings of this study showed that students have positive view towards library. Library really promotes students' self-learning habit and linguistic knowledge as well as develops four language skills and three aspects of language.
