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ABSTRACT

The thesis entitled 'Use of Terminologies Found in Mobile Phones' is an attempt to find out the achievements in English vocabulary learning through the use of mobile phone. For this, data have been collected from four government schools of Dhankuta and Sankhuwasabha districts through written test from the students of class ten who were the mobile users at least for one year. To meet the objectives of the research, ten students from each school were taken as a practical study. The written papers were checked and analysis and interpretation of data had been carried out under different headings. The collected data through different tests were analyzed and interpreted using the tables. After analysis and interpretation of data, it was found that the total vocabulary achievement of the students was 65.75 through the use of mobile phone. So I reached the conclusion that the mobile phone is helpful material to learn the English vocabulary.
