#### **ABSTRACT**

The study entitled **Effectiveness of Listening for Developing Speaking Skill** mainly focuses on to find out the effectiveness of listening practice for developing speaking skill. For this study, the researcher took sample consisting of forty students of Sindhuli Little Flower English Boarding School, Sindhuli. The study was based on primary source of data. The population of the study was sampled through random sampling procedure. Test items were the main tools for the data collection. The researcher came to the conclusion that using teaching materials expressing condolence, expressing congratulation, dialogue, giving direction, describing picture and thanking someone were the main examples of data collection while teaching speaking skill has a significant role to enhance the students' listening habit. Moreover, students were found motivated and actively participated in the classroom. It reveals that experimental group 'B' has achieved more progress in this area than control group 'A'.
