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Abstract

This present dissertation on *A Farewell to Arms* by Ernest Hemingway attempts to show a vivid portrayal of traumatic experience of modern life triggered by the violence of the World War I. This novel identifies modern world's rootless ridge, World War and its destruction and frustrated world view where spirituality is defeated in surge of the materialism leading toward the traumatic dread.
