ABSTRACT

The present study entitled "Proverbs Used in Newspaper Articles and their Nepali Equivalents" is an attempt to examine the structure, frequency and cultural features of proverbs used in newspaper articles. Moreover, this study makes an attempt to observe the Nepali equivalent of the English proverbs. The researcher applied judgmental sampling which is based on the purpose and subjective judgments of the researcher mainly based on the secondary sources of the data. Observation was the tool used for data collection. Altogether 51 proverbs were analyzed. In structure mostly active voice, present tense and simple sentence have been found being used in the respective national dailies. In the study of frequency the researcher found that proverbs are not very frequent in the daily newspapers. Similarly, the study of cultural features concluded that some of the proverbs are different in conveying the meanings due to the difference in culture. The terms that are different are described in the study with their Nepali equivalence.

This thesis is divided into four main chapters and other sub-chapters. The first chapter deals with general background to the study, the English language, mass media, a brief introduction of proverbs, structures of proverbs, proverbs and the English language, the scope of proverbs and proverbs and newspaper articles. The second chapter deals with the methodology adopted for carrying out the study. It includes sources of data, tools for data collection and some limitations of the study. Similarly, the third chapter presents analysis and interpretation of the data collected for the study using simple statistical tools like table, percentage and frequency. Finally, the fourth chapter presents the findings and some recommendations of the study.
