#### **ABSTRACT**

This study has been based on information of 188 respondents from the whole employee women in casino Venus Lainchur Kathmandu. This study has been designed to identify the about the socio-economic status women who worked in casino.

Amongh the 188 respondents, 33.5% are from Courpier, 13.2% and 17.5% from F and B and housekeeping, 11.74% and 5.8% were from GRA and telephone, 5.3% from U.T, and Bouncer, 3.1% from clinic, 2.6% from purchase and 1.6% from H.R. The age of the respondents over 19 years. The highest percentage (78.2%) of the respondents were aged 20-29 years and followed by (17%) 30-39 years. The majority of the respondents are Chhetri (30.3%) are followed by Brahaman (28.8%). Most of the respondents (34.5%) reported their religion as Buddhist.

Employees, who are in their twenties, either late or mid or early are found in absolutely majority. It is claims that young and energetic personalities are preferred in the casino job.

54.7% have had a passed intermediate level and running the bachelor level. 15.9% passed the bachelor degree. Most of the respondents are educated. Although a very few age 2.1 % are illiterate, respondents 33.5 % respondents had to stay that they had been earned 15000 above per month where 25 % said that they earn Rs 10000-15000 per month.

11.3% have found to say that spend 2000 to 3000 per month and 84 (44.6%) hand been found spending 3000 to 5000 per month. Most of the employee said that they spent their money in health and education.

Fully satisfied respondents were 40.42 % where 42.5 % were found unsatisfied. Candidates of self interest were found highest number 44.6% to get casino job.
