#### **ABSTRACT**

The present thesis entitled "The Use of Modals in English Newspapers" aimed to find out the use of modals and phrasal modals in four newspapers viz. The Kathmandu Post, The Rising Nepal, The Times of India and International Herald Tribune. The researcher collected data from those four newspapers through careful observation and studied every news sections. The findings showed that all news sections use modals and phrasal modals, except some exceptions. Modals were used more than phrasal modals.
