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ABSTRACT

This thesis entitled "Subject-Verb Agreement in English and Dhimal" accounts for the subject-verb agreement system in the Dhimal language to compare and contrast with that of the English language and to suggest some pedagogical implications on the basis of the findings derived from the study. The data were collected from the forty native speakers of the Dhimal language. The researcher concluded that the Dhimal verbs agree with tense, aspect, person and number.

This research study contains four chapters. The first chapter deals with the background about the thesis. This chapter contains status of the English language and linguistic scenario in Nepal. This chapter also includes a brief introduction to the Dhimal language, its dialectal varieties, an introduction to CA, some rules of the subject-verb agreement in the English language. In addition, the related literatures, objectives of the study, significance of the study and definitions of the related terms have also been included in the chapter. The second chapter states the procedures adopted for collecting data, sources of data, population of the study and the limitations of the study. Similarly, the third chapter contains the analysis, interpretation and presentation of the data. In this chapter, the subject-verb agreement systems of both the languages have been compared and contrasted in terms of the similarities and differences observed. The findings and some pedagogical implications of the study have been listed in the last chapter.
