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ABSTRACT

The purpose of this study was to determine the effectiveness of inductive and deductive method in teaching English Articles. It is an experimental research. The researcher has selected 36 students studying at Sunrise Public Higher Secondary School, Mahendranagar with judgmental non-random sampling procedure. The data were tabulated and analyzed group wise from different perspective i.e. comparison in general, item wise comparison, gender wise comparison. The result obtained from the analysis of the data showed that deductive method is more effective than inductive method. Therefore, it is recommended that deductive method should be applied by the teachers to teach articles in English.

The thesis is divided into four chapters: introduction, methodology, analysis and interpretation and findings and recommendations. The **first chapter** deals with general background, review of related literature, objectives and significance of the study. The **second chapter** deals with the methodology used to carry out this research. It contained primary and secondary sources of data, process of data collection and limitations of the study. The **third chapter** deals with the analysis and interpretation of the data. This chapter included the analysis of the data, comparison of the performance of the students on the basis of different test items.
