#### **ABSTRACT**

The years after the second Great War (1939-1946 A.D.) were challenging for the development scientists. All the strategies and methodology applied for the advancement in the African, Latin American and Asian nations proved to be a failure, only a little change occurred and it was realized that the progress was slow, overnight leaders and would be leaders believed that new conditions of social economic and political life could be readily created out of purposeful planning (Pandey, 1999; 156).

Last decades were of endless record of bold experiments becoming deep sources of frustration. It became evident that just as, "Rome was not built in a day", the new orders in Asia and Africa cannot be established overnight. There was much innocence, optimism, expectations and futile cynicism so the development experts were left with the pressing challenge of learning more about the nature of political development and the limit for accelerating purposeful change (Sharma,2000:86).
