Abstract

Bankim Chandra Chatterji provokes nationalistic consciousness in his novel Anandamath by setting in the historical background of Indian political context.

The nationalists expect their own model of ruling and sovereignty of the country to make its independent future and fortunes. In this regard the novel contains anti-British sentiments in Indian public.
