ABSTRACT

This dissertation entitled 'Language Study on SMS' is an attempt to find out and describe the characteristic features of the English Language used in SMS. The study presents the comparative analysis of the characteristics of English used in SMS. The comparison is on such areas as syntactic structures, mechanics of writing, abbreviations, non-linguistic signs, numerals, code mixing, and formality of language. This study is beneficial to the students, teachers, syllabus designers and critical mass that are involved in teaching and learning about the communication through SMS. More specifically, this study will be directly or indirectly significant to the person who is interested in SMS communication.

The data for this study have been collected from naturally occurring SMS of the English Language Teachers and Non-English Language Teachers who are teaching in the secondary level and the higher secondary level through their cell phones using quota sampling procedure. The SMS were in-coming and out-going used by the SMS users in their natural communication.

This study consists of four chapters. Chapter One consists of general background, review of the related literature, objectives of the study, significance of the study.

Chapter Two deals with methodology. It encompasses the sources of data, population of the study, sampling procedure, tools of data collection, process of data collection, and limitation of the study.
