ABSTRACT

The main purpose of this study is to find out proficiency of the Tenth Grades of Surkhet District in using articles by comparing different variables in terms of area and sex. This study differs from the others in its sample population, area of the study and statistical tool applied.

For collecting data, the researcher took one hundred sample students studying in Grade Ten from Ten Secondary Schools (5 from rural area and 5 from urban area) of Surkhet district 10 students from each school in equal sex ratio were selected randomly and administered the test items meant for them.

The study found that the average score of the Tenth Graders of Surkhet district is 32.63. In totality, 50% students were above average and 50% students were below average. Thus, the students were constantly proficient in the use of articles because their performance was equal in both above and below average. The students of urban area were found to be more proficient than those of schools of rural areas by 12%. Boys were found more proficient than those of girls by 8%. Both boys and girls of schools of urban area were better than that of schools of rural area.

The study has been presented four chapters: Introduction, Methodology, Analysis and Interpretation and Findings and Recommendations.

The first chapter deals with general background, English in Nepal, importance of grammar, language teaching and language testing, proficiency test articles in English review of related literature, objectives of the study, definition terms and significance of the study.

The second chapter deals with sources of data, population of the study, tools for collecting data process of data collection and limitation of the study.

The third chapter consists of item-wise analysis and status of proficiency in using articles by Ten Grades of Surkhet District, comparison of different variables with the average of each item, analysis and interpretation of total proficiency of the students comparison of total proficiency by area and sex, school wise comparison of proficiency total (Ten) School with the total average score and comparison of proficiency with the secondary level norm.

In fourth chapter presents the findings obtained from analysis and interpretation of data and some recommendations on the basis of the finding.

In the final section of the study bibliography and appendices are clearly mentioned/included.
