ANALYSIS AND ACHIEVEMENT OF GRADE TWO ENGLISH VOCABULARY

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ABSTRACT

This research is about analysis and achievement of Grade II English vocabulary of Government schools. The research is carried out to mark the Grade II English vocabulary in two ways: firstly the study on total vocabulary items, the frequency and the items just introduced in Grade II; secondly the achievement under the sub-headings total vocabulary achievement, schoolwise achievement, itemwise achievement, and the difficulty level of the vocabulary items. To carry out this research, the researcher descriptively studied the Grade II vocabulary items, then the researcher administered the final achievement of vocabulary items developing a-hundred-mark's test sheet. The researcher randomly selected three government schools, 30 students from each and the test was administered. The researcher listed the items and presented the result of test objectively and precisely.

The research work found 413 words to be used in Grade II English textbook which belonged to different parts of speech. Nouns occupied almost a half (47.7%) of the total vocabulary used in Grade II. There were 272 items which were introduced in Grade II only.

The second portion was about vocabulary achievement under different sub-headings. 50% or above (out of 100%) was supposed to be satisfactory result. The achievement was found quite satisfactory since majority (92.22%) of students were found above the average level (50% or above). It was a good achievement in total. Nouns were the easiest for the students than other vocabulary items.

The present study is divided into four major chapters. The first chapter deals with a short introduction of English language in general; curriculum, syllabus, textbook, vocabulary, literature review, objectives and significance of the study. The second chapter concerns with the methodology adopted to carry out this research work.

The third chapter analyses and interprets the data. It presents the vocabulary used in the Grade II textbook, achievement of vocabulary by the students and the difficulty level of the students.

The fourth chapter deals with major findings and the recommendations of the present study.

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
