Abstract

This dissertation concentrates on the critical study of Robert Louis Stevenson's novel *Treasure Island* in which he depicts the journey from innocence to experience particularly through the character Jim and exposes the evils of adult world and insight into the duplicity of human character by employing upon the medieval narrative tradition of the romantic quest theme. *Treasure Island* recounts a boy's journey from innocence to experience, giving the physical adventure of a pirate story of a heightened significance where Jim not only gets treasure but also knowledge about himself. At the surface level the physical journey of quest can be seen through naked eyes but at the psychological level the hidden quest of Jim is unrevealed. This novel potrays the theme of quest at both physical and psychological levels. The protagonist fulfils both the physical and mental quest along with adventure and romance that helps Jim enter the world experience from that of innocence.
