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ABSTRACT

This research is basically a study of English code mixing in modern Nepali poems. It aims at analyzing the English expressions mixed in the poems composed during the modern era of Nepali literature. The primary sources of data were the composers and readers of modern Nepali poems. Similarly, the secondary sources of data were the poems composed during the modern age. The required data were gathered by employing judgmental non - random sampling. That is to say, only thirty poems were selected out of the poems composed from the time of Lekh Nath Poudel to the date. Likewise, 15 composers and 15 readers of the modern Nepali poetry were chosen to obtain their attitude towards English code mixing. The data was analyzed using simple statistical tools like frequency and percentage. The findings of the study show that out of different English expressions, words are mixed maximally in modern Nepali poetry. Within words also, nouns are mixed more than other word classes (verbs, adjectives, adverbs). It is found that modern poems contain different English expressions due to globalization of English and rapid development of modern science and technology. Similarly, writers' English background, lacks of actual Nepali equivalent terms, etc. are the major reasons for English code mixing in modern Nepali poetry.

The first chapter deals with general background, review of the related literature, objective of the study and so on. Similarly, the second chapter deals with the methodology adopted and the third chapter consists of the analysis and interpretation of the collected data. Finally, the fourth chapter deals with the findings and recommendations.
