#### ABSTRACT

The thesis entitled "Teaching Writing Through Process Writing" aimed at developing writing skill through process writing in written composition. The researcher herself was involved in the experimental teaching for the purpose of carrying out the research. The researcher collected data from the sampled population of 14 students of grade nine from a private school of Kaski district. A pre-test was administered by using the test items prepared beforehand. After that they were taught using proper process writing mainly being based on White and Arndt (1991). The researcher taught to the students for three weeks. After the experimental teaching, a post-test was administered and results of both the tests were compared to find out the development of the students in free composition through process writing.

The thesis consists of four chapters. The first chapter is an introductory chapter. It is a composite of the general background, writing skill, and its importance, mechanic of writing, characteristics of good writing, stages of teaching writing, process writing, steps of process writing, review of the related literature, objectives of the study and significance of the study. Chapter two deals with the methodology adopted to carry out the research. It consists of sources of data, tools for data collection, process of data collection and limitations of the study. Chapter three consists of analysis and interpretation of the data. Chapter four contains of findings and recommendations. Finally, references and appendices are listed.

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
