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Abstract

This study entitled "Chamling and English Kinship Terms: A Comparative Study" attempts to find out Chamling kinship terms used for various relations and compare these with English kinship relations. To accomplish the objectives of the study, the researcher collected data from the Chamling native speakers of Lekharka VDC of Bhojpur District. The sample size of the study consisted of 60 Chamling native speakers who were selected using purposive sampling procedure. An interview schedule was used to collect Chamling kinship terms. The study shows that Chamling kinship terms are rich in comparison with English kinship terms. English has various cover terms such as cousin, siblings, offspring, etc. Whereas such cover terms are rarely found in Chamling. There is no any distinction between the terms used by male and female ego except the two terms 'husband' and 'wife' in English whereas Chamling has distinctive kinship terms on the basis of male and female ego.

This thesis consists of four chapters. The first chapter deals with general background, review of the related literature, objectives of the study, significance of the study and definition of various kinship terms.

The second chapter includes sources of data, research tools and process of data collection, and limitation of the study.

The third chapter consists of analysis and interpretation of the data obtained. Lastly, the fourth chapter comprises findings and recommendation of the thesis.
