Abstract

This dissertation analyses the westerners' biased representation of the migrant people as the Other in relation to David Gutterson's *Snow Falling on Cedars*. The stereotypes and prejudice constructed by the West about Japanese-American are the main focus of the study. Guterson illustrates the picture of Japanese-American who is stereotyped as the criminal and violent by the western officers.
