Abstract

The present dissertation titled "Struggle for Existence in Chekhov's *The Seagull*" focuses on the characters who are struggling for their existence amidst the problematic and frustrated conditions of their lives. The play studies the vanity of an actress, Arkadin; the idleness of a fashionable novelist, Trigorin who dabbles in love; the hopelessness of the actress' unloved son, Treplev; and the young girl, Nina, he adores and who is seduced by the novelist.
